Where to go for Jaca Trees.

- o Ryan St/Gwydir Highway, South Grafton: Known for beautiful jacaranda trees.
- Bacon St, Grafton: Another great spot to see the trees.
- o Mary St, Grafton: Located near the hospital, this is a recommended area.
- o See St, Grafton: A well-known location for viewing the flowers.
- o Cranworth St, Grafton: Offers beautiful jacaranda-lined streets.
- Earl St, Grafton: Another street to consider for your outing.
- Bakers Lane, Carrs Creek: A location to explore for more jacaranda views.

If you have time, there are a few nice trees at Junction Hill right up the top near a bus stop.

Trees in general are the fig trees in fig tree avenue located;

- o Cnr of Victoria & Villiers Sts big Moreton Bay Fig with character.
- Cnr of Prince and Victoria is our pride and joy Fig estimated to be over 150 years old, dating back to before the city was proclaimed in 1885.
- Just up the street towards the Crown Hotel is two heritage trees called "Babbas Trees" with unusual trunks with fruit growing on branches.
- The Boulevard is across from the Crown and has beautiful garden beds of flowers.

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Key architectural styles and periods

- Victorian and Edwardian: This is the most prominent style in Grafton, seen in many of the city's historic buildings and found throughout its heritage trails.
- Georgian: An example of early Georgian architecture can be found in a cottage on the Anglican Church Precinct, built around 1850.
- 20th Century: Significant 20th-century buildings include the present St. Mary's Church (1914), the Bishopholme residence (1924), and the 1915 Grafton Bridge, known as the "Bendy Bridge". @

Notable examples

- Christ Church Cathedral: A significant landmark that has been classified by the National Trust.
- Grafton Gaol: Also classified by the National Trust and part of the city's heritage trail.
- Prentice House: A late Victorian residence built in 1880, considered one of the city's finest examples from that period, and now home to the Grafton Regional Gallery.
- Anglican Church Precinct: Features a mix of architectural periods, including the
 1924 Bishopholme residence and older Georgian and Victorian cottages.
- Grafton Bridge: Known as the "Bendy Bridge," this 1915 structure is a notable piece of engineering and architecture.
